The chosen recipients will display perseverance and diligence as a student. The students must be caring, generous, responsible, and involved in their communities.

CRITERIA:

- Awarded to three self-declared First Nations/Metis students attending a high school with in the File Hills Qu'Appelle Tribal Council, Prairie Valley SD, Regina Catholic SD, or Regina Public SD who is wanting to enrol in the UR Accelerated program at the University of Regina.
- This bursary is designed to reflect the values and intents of the donor.
 - a) Academic Achievement (Displays perseverance and diligence as a student). Grade 11/12 average of all subjects and overall Grade 11-12 average will be considered by the committee.
 - b) Enrolled in the UR Accelerated program.
 - c) Is caring, generous and involved in their community; displays potential and responsibility; strong desire to succeed; financial need; positive attitude.
- Letter(s) of recommendation from a Principal and/or Career Counsellor – (please include relevant specifics as per school activities; consider student involvement in school and community activities);
- School generated Grade 11-12 high school transcripts submitted with the application;
- The attached rubric will be utilized in determining the scholarship recipient.

The selection committee will be in contact with the recipient and payment will be submitted to the University of Regina.

The bursary package should contain:

- Cover letter from the student (be specific about school and community involvement – list and explain what it is you did and provide examples)
- Letter of recommendation from the principal and/or career counsellor.
- Completed application form.
