Regina District Industry Education Council (RDIEC) represents Regina Public School Division, Regina Catholic School Division, Prairie Valley School Division and File Hills Qu'Appelle Tribal Council. The RDIEC's **Career Connections** program provides an opportunity for interested Grade 10-12 students to obtain entry level skills and industry recognized safety training certification. Participating students also have the opportunity to obtain a high school credit upon completion of the work experience component. This program involves 3 steps:

<p>1) Skill Acquisition This is an introduction to the career area and basic skill development. It is a 25 hour commitment. During this phase, the students will acquire industry specific entry level skills in the career highlighted.</p>	<p>2) Safety Training The students will complete the following: 1) WHMIS 2015 2) YWRT-Young Workers Readiness Training 3) SCOT-Saskatchewan Construction Orientation Training. 4) MHWT- Mental Health Wellness Training 5) Fall Protection Training 6) Respiratory Protection Training</p>	<p>3) Career Work Exploration High School Credit (Optional) If students want to continue this program, there is the option for them to complete a work experience placement related to the skills they acquired and earn a Career and Work Experience credit on their high school transcript. The amount of time required is approximately 50 hours. The total time commitment must be 100 hours. In order for students to be able to access this opportunity, they must complete all the skill acquisition and safety training.</p>

This connection will focus on Bricklaying/ Masonry at the Bricklayers and Allied Craft workers Local 1 in Regina. Students should be interested in the skilled trades and have time in their personal schedules to fulfill the commitment of this program. Steel toed boots and safety glasses are required and may be supplied by contacting Gordon Heidel at 306-537-2960. **Students will meet at 1645 Reynolds Street for each of their skill building sessions.** There will be 5 skill sessions in all with the first one on **Tuesday, November 1 from 1-6 pm. The other dates are Tuesday, November 8, Tuesday, November 22, Tuesday, November 29 and Tuesday, December 6.** They must arrive 10 minutes prior to the session starting. The school will allow students to attend and the absence will be excused but students are responsible for all material missed in class that day. This is a total commitment of 25 hours.
