Regina District Industry Education Council (RDIEC) represents Regina Public School Division, Regina Catholic School Division, Prairie Valley School Division and File Hills Qu'Appelle Tribal Council. The RDIEC's **Skills Bootcamp** program provides an opportunity for interested Grade 10-12 students to obtain entry level skills and industry recognized safety training certification. This program involves 2 steps.

<p>1) Skill Acquisition 25 hours (Mandatory) This is an introduction to the career area and basic skill development. This will be a 25 hour commitment. During this phase, the students will acquire industry specific entry level skills in the career highlighted.</p>	<p>2) Career Safety Education Students will have to complete the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">a) Young Workers Readiness Certificate, WHMIS 2015, Mental Health Wellness Training, Hearing Protection & Respiratory Protection Trainingb) SCOT (Safety Construction Orientation Training) once the Sask Safety training is done students will be e-mailed a code for the SCOT Safety training. **DUE March 27, 2024.
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This connection will focus on the Welding Trade and will be taught by Sask Polytechnic instructors in a state of the art shop. Students should be interested in the skilled trades and have time in their personal schedules to fulfill the commitment of this program. Students must dress appropriately for working in this industry. Steel toed shoes are required (which can be borrowed from RDIEC) Students will meet at Sask Polytechnic Wascana Campus for each of their skill building sessions.
